How to Scene for Beginners Where does the demoscene come from?

- A Brief History of the scene
 - First: (1980s) Software Cracker/Warez-Scene (Copy parties) and intros for releases
 - Drop the warez, let's just do the intros.
 - Why only small intros? Let's go crazy!
 - The demoscene is born.
 - A few decades later (now):
 UNESCO national intangible cultural heritage
 - 2020: Finland
 - 2021: Germany and Poland
 - 2023: The Netherlands and Switzerland
 - 2025: Sweden and soon: France

...and more

How to Scene for Beginners Demoscene today

The Demoscene and it's productions has reached the mainstream in museums, festivals, conferences, universities, as well as the games and entertainment industry in the last years. Here are a few examples:

- **Museums & exhibitions:** Finnish Museum of Games-Suomen Pelimuseo in Tampere, Vapriikki Museum Centre in Tampere, Computer Games Museum in Berlin, National Museum of Technology in Warsaw
- Conferences: ACM SIGGRAPH, Brisbane, Australia
- **Universities:** The demoscene has become an object of study at universities for example: Helsinki (FI), München (DE), Berlin (DE), Krakow (PL), Poznan (PL).
- Games: EA DICE, Ubisoft, Guerrilla Games, Rovio Entertainment, Square Enix, CD Project Red
- Motion Pictures: Pixar
- **Music:** The tools developed hy demo groups e.g. Notch are often used for visual effects at concerts and events, for example by Metallica, Hans Zimmer or Gorillaz.
- **In addition** there have been documentary movies, radio interviews and even some books about the demoscene produced and published.


How to Scene for Beginners What are we doing here?

Compos

- Rule of thumb for sorting "Better entries come later"
- There will most likely be "weird" entries
- There will most certainly be insider jokes in entries or in crowd reactions
 - Ask someone around you if you don't understand what is going on
- Stick to the competition rules, they are there to create an even playing field for all participants.
- There is no censorship, but some topics are reason for disqualification of your entry: racism, sexism, ableism, homophobia, transphobia, xenophobia or discrimination.
 - The guideline is: Be respectful to others.

General stuff

- In case of emergencies contact an orga/the infodesk. Emergency services can be reached by the public phone number 112 free of charge.
- Demoparties are relatively safe places, so it is possible to leave your stuff at your table. But: Ask someone nicely to keep watch.
- This is **not** an ideal place for children. Mainly due to noise. And \$things happening.
- Wear ear protection! There may be sudden loud noises/announcements.
- No smoking/vaping inside the hall anytime.
- Please no stickers on walls, floors or other surfaces of the E Werk. It's a historic building.
- The real party is outside!

Infodesk

- Next to the entrance you should have passed it on the way inside
- Get (free) earplugs there, as it will be quite LOUD!
- Get some cool stickers to beautify your stuff.
- Fill up on coffee or tea for free or get other beverages for reasonable prices.
- T-shirts (required preorder) and some select (IT) \$stuff also on sale.
- If you have any questions or need to contact an orga / mentor, they can help you get in touch.
- In general: You need \$something ask the infodesk.

Outside area

- Access via the ramp next to the second stage
- Foodstuffs for sale
- Shower Containers
- Bonfire
- Tent with tables and benches (smoking is ok there)

Toilets

- Entrance to the famous toilet tunnel right next to the Infodesk.
- Tag boards in the toilet tunnel
- Interesting \$things to see in the alcoves of the toilet tunnel (may include sleeping/chilling sceners)

Showers

- Containers in the outside area
- Please note that the containers are not open/operating 24/7!

Sleeping

- First come, first serve. Reserve your spot ASAP, if you haven't already.
- Where:
 - Behind the bigscreen
 - Under/next to your table
 - At the side ways of the hall
 - In the toilet tunnel (quieter, but cold and constant stream of people)
- Remember: Evacuation ways / emergency doors must remain clear!

Shopping

- There are plenty of stores around the party place.
- Please note that the stores are open only on Saturday due to easter holidays in Germany.

How to Scene for Beginners Where do Lupload my entry/vote?

- A brief introduction to PartyMeister and how to upload an entry.
- Hints:
 - **Be nice to your compo orgas**: Do not wait until the deadline to upload entries, do it as soon as you can. Later corrections are possible.
 - Before you submit your entry please read and follow the compo rules (not only the general ones, but also the specific ones for your compo). Again: the rules are there to allow a fair competition
 - Four most important general points:
 - 1) Compo entries must not have been released before.
 - 2) Entries have to be free of third party rights unless you have a legal license to use the given content.
 - 3) Keep your file names as short and precise as possible = EntryName-Step1.xyz, EntryName-Step2.xyz, etc... (this eases the compo orga work)
 - 4) No AI in gfx and music compos! For usage in other compos please check the rules.






